Message from Pastor Blume Kingdom Parables Have a Message for Us

Jesus used parables as a primary tool for teaching His disciples about the kingdom of God. A parable is a story that illustrates a spiritual lesson. As we read these parables today, we learn great scriptural truths that challenge our understanding of God's kingdom priorities and our behavior.

The Bible says when John the Baptist began preaching in the wilderness of Judea, he said, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (Matthew 3:2, NKJV) When Jesus began His ministry, He said, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Matthew 4:17, NKJV) When He sent His disciples out, Jesus said, "And as you go, preach, saying, the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Matthew 10:7, NKJV)

Jesus mentioned the kingdom of God 126 times in His preaching. This was the central message He

consistently proclaimed through parables, miracles and ministry. So, it must be important!

In February, I am continuing to preach on Jesus' kingdom parables in our Sunday service. Each parable confronts the way we think, our lifestyle and our habits. So, each one should cause us to evaluate every part of our life. The Bible is always our standard.

As you come to worship each Sunday, ask the Father to speak to you in worship. Open your heart and mind to everything God says to you. Pray for one another! Pray for the Pastor Search Committee. Pray for those around you who do not know Jesus. I love you and I am praying for you. Thank you for praying for me.
